Theme: Jesus - Transfiguration

Try it yourself!

Craft: Create transfiguration drawings!

- Use crayons or colours to create 'rays of light' on the paper
- Cut out / use pre-cut Jesus template and stick on top of rays of light



Chat about it!

Object lesson. Show the children a lamp that is switched off. Until the transfiguration, we had clues that Jesus was special, but people weren't sure. When the transfiguration happened, it was like turning on this light (turn on). People knew once and for all that Jesus was God's son!

Prayer

Thank you God that you sent us your son Jesus. Thank you that we see in the bible that he is so important. We see that the Holy Spirit came on Jesus when he was baptised. We know the Jesus is your son!

Encourage the children to talk to God themselves. Ask them to tell Jesus something the like about their home and family.

Worship and Pray

Pray: Write the name of someone you would like to pray for on a lolly stick or strip of paper. Pray for them and then pop the stick/paper in a pot or container. Over the next few days, repeat this until you have a pot with a few different names. You can now pick a different stick and pray for someone different each time you gather to pray.
