Theme: Worship

This month we are thinking about worship. We have a time of worship every week when we sing songs to God. But why? We are going to be thinking about why and how we worship God. During this month, some people are going to help us learn different ways we can worship God.

Craft: Today we're making things to celebrate Jesus with!



- Children decorate the kitchen roll tube
- Glue the inside of the bottom of the tube
- Attach paper tissue streamers
- (Adults may need to staple tissue paper as well)
- Stick small label that says 'Let Everything that has Breath Praise the Lord'
- When you blow the tube, the streamers will rustle!

Chat about it!

We want to tell God how amazing He is. This is called worship. We sing or dance or say thank you when we pray. We also want to say thank you for everything He has done for us and given us.

This week we're learning about how everything that has breath, should praise the Lord! That means humans, animals, everything! It might be hard to imagine your dog or family pet worshipping God but this verse just means that everything in the world was created by God and for Him. When we worship, we join in with so much praise! God really is the best!

Part of worshipping God could be loving and looking after the world that He made. Why don't you think of some ways you could love the world God made? Whether that's loving God's people, being kind, loving the planet and learning about all the animals and how we can look after them?

Worship and Pray

Pray: Write the name of someone you would like to pray for on a lolly stick or strip of paper. Pray for them and then pop the stick/paper in a pot or container. Over the next few days, repeat this until you have a pot with a few different names. You can now pick a different stick and pray for someone different each time you gather to pray.
