Theme: Jesus Walks on Water

This month we are looking for clues throughout the bible that show us how important Jesus is. He was like no other human being. He was fully God but fully human. Let's see how many clues we can find....

This week we are looking at how Jesus walks on the water during a storm and calms the waves!

We don't have to be scared when we remember that Jesus is with us, just like he was with the disciples and calmed the storm that was rocking their boat.

Sometimes in our life things can seem like a bit of a storm, things might be a little tough or you might seem a bit scared. Why don't you spend some time thinking about those time and how Jesus was with you. Perhaps you feel like you're in a storm now, maybe ask Jesus to show you how he can calm it!

Worship and Pray
